Lucy* aged 16 had to leave school and home abruptly. In fact, she had to run. Unfortunately her story is too familiar. Over 40% of those experiencing homelessness in Australia are aged 25 or younger.

Most young people experiencing homelessness are not homeless by choice. It is their only option. Often they are hidden. Young people who are homeless are also more likely to experience higher unemployment than the rest of the population, often have worse health outcomes, and have little to no income.

Homelessness can become a cycle once started, especially when so young.

We engage youth through education, awareness and volunteer programs, which play a vital role in prevention and support as well as many outreach services.

THE LIGHT AT THE END OF THE TUNNEL

Lisa and Louise have been volunteering with Rosies' outreach to the Brisbane Youth Detention Centre for over a decade. Here Lisa and Louise give us an inside of their experience.

"The outreach starts with the usual formalities. We first sign in. IDs are checked. We then go through the metal detector before passing the security gates. We are in. We find out who we will visit (that day) according to the recent events, behaviours, and moods.

Most detainees come from dysfunctional families and do not receive any visit, but ours.

There are a number of sections to the centre. Each has about 5 to 12 young detainees. We join the three staff members who are also present in the room. We have never felt unsafe while taking part to this

outreach. Many of these young people are surprised we come to visit them. They make us feel humble, as seeing a friendly face from Rosies can have a big impact on them. Especially when they are told we are volunteers. The simple fact of being there regularly makes a difference. We often do not realise how much of a positive impact such small things can mean. Just remembering their name, bringing a new card game, a smile, or the simple fact of being here for them makes a difference."

It is only thanks to our wonderful volunteers, like Lisa and Louise, that Rosies can continue outreaches such as this. You *make* a difference by volunteering too or donating now at rosies.org.au.
